The Barley Council of Canada (BCC) is a not-for-profit organization incorporated in 2013, with membership from producer groups and the barley value chain across Canada. The BCC's mission is to work together to ensure long-term profitability and sustainable growth of Canada's barley industry.

The first and current National Barley Cluster, begun in 2013, is a five-year, \$11 million AgriScience cluster administered by the Alberta Barley Commission in collaboration with a grower-industry funding consortium and Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) under the Industry-Led Research and Development Stream of the Growing Forward 2 (GF2) AgriInnovation Program. As this current agricultural policy framework (APF) comes to an end in March 2018, BCC has taken the lead, working again with a grower-industry consortium, to develop a new National Barley Cluster for submission to the next version of research funding initiatives that will be announced under the next APF.

In preparation for this new cluster application, BCC is inviting researchers to submit letters of intent (LOI) for the second National Barley Cluster. The next APF is expected to be accepting funding applications by summer 2017 and be fully launched by April 1, 2018.

The BCC's National Barley Cluster will support and develop a group of projects that address our national barley research priorities. In order to fully benefit from the cluster structure under the next APF, the BCC has been and will continue to coordinate and collaborate with the groups and organizations leading other clusters, including the Canadian Field Crop Research Alliance (CFCRA), the Beef Cattle Research Council, Swine Innovation Porc, and the Western Grains Research Foundation (WGRF).

Researchers are not required to submit their LOI to the Office of Research for approval before submission to the sponsor. Researchers are asked to send a copy of their LOI to the Office of Research for information purposes only (no OR-5 required at the LOI stage). Researchers will be notified by sponsor if they are invited to submit a full proposal.
- 2. **Full Proposal:** Those invited to submit a full proposal must submit their full proposal to the Office of Research two weeks in advance of the sponsor's deadline with a signed OR-5.
