# **Description**

The Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) is pleased to announce the <u>Initiative for Digital Citizen Research</u> [2] (IDCR), a new joint initiative with the Department of Canadian Heritage (PCH) and one component of Canadian Heritage's <u>Digital Citizen Initiative</u> [3].

Canadian Heritage is partnering with the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) to provide research grants and research training supplements through three armslength funding opportunities: SSHRC <a href="Insight Grants">Insight Grants</a> [4] and the SSHRC <a href="Postdoctoral">Postdoctoral</a> <a href="Fellowships">Fellowships</a> [5] . This funding provides assistance to selected postsecondary institution-affiliated researchers and postdoctoral scholars to conduct research related to online disinformation and other online harms as well as their impact in the Canadian context.

The Joint Initiative has 3 broad objectives:

- to promote Canadian research that will develop better understanding based on empirical evidence — of the impacts of online disinformation in Canada in order to better inform programs and policies;
- to build Canada's capacity to conduct research on and related to countering online disinformation and other related online harms, specifically in the target areas described below; and
- to help foster a community of research in the digital citizenship and online disinformation space in Canada.

# **Eligibility**

Researchers affiliated with a Canadian postsecondary institution eligible to hold SSHRC funding.

# **Maximum Project Value**

The Joint Initiative's Research Grants are available for **Insight Grant** applications and are worth up to a maximum of \$100,000 annually, but not totaling more than \$250,000 in a 3-year period.

**Insight Grant** applicants who request funding for up to 5 years and for more than \$250,000 via the Insight Grant application may also be considered for the Joint Initiative's funding. Those applicants will be requested to resubmit an adjusted 3-year budget.

A minimum request of \$7,000 is required in at least 1 year of the project.

The Joint Initiative's Research Grant supplements worth up to \$20,000 are available to successful **Insight Grant** recipients, in addition to the value of their grant.

# **Funding terms**

Each application for a Joint Initiative Research Grant is adjudicated first by the relevant SSHRC adjudication committee. If the application is ranked above the 5th and 6th sextiles, it is then referred to the Canadian Heritage Digital Citizen Research Consultative Body, which assesses whether the research will contribute to enhance the understanding of the impacts of online disinformation in Canada.

The committee reviews each application and forms a consensus on whether the proposed research adequately meets the funding opportunity's objectives and target areas. The applications of SSHRC Postdoctoral Fellowship and Doctoral Award holders that are relevant to the Joint Initiative's target areas will also be referred to the Canada Heritage Digital Citizen Research Consultative Body for a relevance review.

The Canadian Heritage Digital Citizen Initiative Consultative Body's decisions cannot be appealed.

All grant and award holders are expected to use their grant or supplement funding to participate at the annual Conference on Digital Citizen Research to be organized by Canadian Heritage. Postdoctoral Fellowship and Doctoral Award supplement holders may be eligible for additional funding to offset lodging and travel expenses related to the conference, as determined on a case-by-case basis.
