Undergraduates and Graduates involved with Animal Care Duties on their Own Projects

Guideline

University staff, including undergraduate and graduate students, employed by research facilities as animal care attendants must have completed all components of the University of Guelph Animal User Training Program core program (Core modules and hands on workshops). Undergraduate students and graduate students who are employed on a part time or full time basis as animal care attendants must also have ready access to animal care staff who are regular University staff employees and whose normal duties involves animal care. Out of hours, this may simply be by telephone. An exception to this is graduate students involved in the animal care aspects of their own research projects, where, at a minimum, there must also be daily inspections of the animals by a regular animal care staff member.
