

Research Ethics Board Recruitment: Indigenous Research Expert

What is the Research Ethics Board (REB)?

The University of Guelph REB is a committee that reviews all research involving human participants according to the Tri-Council Policy Statement on Ethics in Human Research. The University of Guelph REB consist of faculty representatives, graduate student representatives, individuals with legal, medical, and ethical expertise, and community members. Among the human participant studies that are reviewed, the REB manages numerous Indigenous research protocols and the need for high quality ethical review of proposed research has never been more important.

Seeking Member with Indigenous Research Expertise

The REB is seeking an individual with Indigenous research expertise to join our Board for a 2-year renewable term. The person in this role will help the REB review the ethical acceptability of research ethics applications relating to all human participant research with, for, and about Indigenous peoples and communities, and research using animals on Indigenous lands. The work is fully remote with a time commitment of approximately 2-3 hours per month. In recognition of the knowledge, expertise, and lived experience, an annual honorarium will be provided by the institution.
