

15. ANIMAL PURCHASES FROM RESEARCH GRANTS AND CONTRACTS  
AND DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUE FROM SALE OF ANIMALS

The following describes the policy and procedures covering the purchase of animals (included are: beef and dairy cattle, swine, goats, sheep, horses and poultry) on research grants and contracts and the distribution of revenue from the sale of such animals.

1. RESEARCH GRANTS

- 1.1 When animals are purchased from research grant funds, and feed costs or animal maintenance costs are obtained from the same research grants, then all revenue will be returned to that research grant account for the use of the grantee.
- 1.2 When animals are purchased with OMAFRA funds, and feed costs or animal maintenance costs come from research grants, then all revenue from the sale of animals will be distributed accordingly to the provisions of Policy GE.3.0 in the University of Guelph Administrative Policy Guide (Administration of the Agreement with OMAFRA).
- 1.3 When animals are purchased with grant funds, and feed costs or animal maintenance costs come from OMAFRA funds, or from other contracts, then any revenue up to the purchase price of the animals will be returned to a research trust account for the use of the grantee. The balance of the revenue will be returned to the University.

2. RESEARCH CONTRACTS

- 2.1 When animals are purchased for a research contract by the University and the contract contains the animal purchase costs and the feed costs or animal maintenance costs, then all revenue from the sale of animals will be returned to the sponsor unless the sponsor wishes to direct it otherwise.
- 2.2 When animals for a research contract are purchased with OMAFRA funds, and feed costs or animal maintenance costs come from a contract, then all revenue from the sale of animals will be distributed accordingly to the provisions of Policy GE.3.0 in the University of Guelph Administrative Policy Guide (Administration of the Agreement with OMAFRA).
- 2.3 When animals for a research contract are purchased with OMAFRA funds, and feed costs or animal maintenance costs come from a contract, then all revenue from the sale of animals will be returned to OMAFRA.
